Dear Friends at Suffolk Christian Church,

As we close out this incredible year, I wanted to take a moment to share the amazing impact your partnership has had on our community through Kalamoo's LEGO and Robotics programs. Your generosity in opening your doors to us every Monday and Thursday has truly been a blessing!

What We Accomplished This Fall

This fall, we used the LEGO Education BricQ curriculum, which brought physics concepts to life for our students. Through hands-on building and experimentation, students explored forces, motion, and interactions using specially designed LEGO models. They investigated concepts like balance, momentum, and energy transfer – not just reading about physics but actually experiencing it! Watching their eyes light up as they discovered how scientific principles work in the real world never gets old.

We welcomed everyone in the community to participate free of charge, and the response was incredible:

Monday Sessions:

- Average of 28 students each week
 - 9 students on competitive teams
 - 19 in our STEAM club (non-competitive)
- 4 dedicated team mentors and coaches
- All students were homeschoolers
- Every parent/guardian actively participated in various roles

Thursday Sessions:

- Average of 29 students each week
 - 11 students on competitive teams
 - 18 in our STEAM club
- 8 committed mentors and coaches
- A wonderful blend of homeschoolers, private and public school students
- All parents/guardians actively participated

Wednesday Morning at God's Homeschool Warriors Co-op:

- We also offered this same program serving 26 students!

One of the most heartwarming aspects of this program has been the family involvement. While we did offer a drop-off option for \$75 per month, not a single family chose it! Instead, parents and guardians enthusiastically participated alongside their children. The joy on students' faces when working alongside their parents was truly special – it reminded us that learning is most powerful when families can experience it together.

Competition Success - Putting Suffolk on the Map!

We're incredibly proud to share that our three FIRST LEGO League teams competed at the Challenge in Newport News against 26 teams total. Our teams were the only ones representing Suffolk, Virginia! All three teams did remarkably well with solid scores, and we're thrilled to announce that our Robo Diggers team is advancing to the state competition on January 10th! That same day, our Tech team will be competing in their very first meet. What an exciting way to start 2026!

An Important Evolution - Rebranding Our Programs

We received valuable feedback from the Suffolk Foundation that's helping us communicate more clearly about what we do. When reviewing our grant application, they thought we were simply putting out buckets of bricks for free play – they didn't realize that LEGO has rigorous educational curriculum! The kits we use are SOL and NGSS-approved and align with established educational standards. This feedback made it clear that we need program names that immediately communicate the depth and quality of our educational offerings. We'll be introducing new names that better reflect the STEAM education and robotics focus at the heart of what we do.

Looking Ahead to 2026

We're so excited about what's coming next year! We're planning an Easter Arts Outreach where Brittany will be leading an Easter play that brings together churches and organizations across our community for an arts-focused celebration. We're also hoping to partner with The Mount at Suffolk to expand our LEGO Robotics and Clubs there once their new facility is ready.

Thank you for believing in Kalamoo's mission to champion Suffolk's transformation into a regional STEAM hub. Your support has made it possible for us to serve 57 students each week right here at Suffolk Christian Church, creating opportunities for all learners and truly connecting our community through education. 
